


I protect myself and others when using pesticides

Before spraying...



I buy approved and properly labeled pesticides.



I keep pesticides outside the house, in a locked place.




I transport the pesticides myself in their original, sealed, and secure containers.



I read the instructions and safety guidelines.

During spraying...



I mark the fields to prevent others from entering them.



I wear personal protective equipment (PPE).



I mix the product in the fields while wearing my PPE.



I don't let anyone into the fields during and immediately after spraying.

After spraying...



I clean my equipment immediately in the fields.



I wash myself in the fields immediately after removing my equipment.



I do not reuse empty containers and I take them to an approved collection point.

I protect myself with personal protective equipment

I put on the PPE correctly

- 1** I inspect each part to detect any damage (tears, leaks, etc.).


- 2** I put on the suit, making sure that it covers my entire body.

- 3** I put the boots under the suit.

- 4** I put on chemical-resistant gloves under the sleeves of my suit.

- 5** I put on the protection for my nose, eyes and face.


I remain vigilant during spraying



I avoid touching my face



I remain vigilant for damage signs

I remove the PPE carefully



I remove the PPE outside of contaminated areas



I take off my gloves last

I clean the PPE thoroughly

- 1 Preparation**
 - I prepare to clean everything in a well-ventilated area, away from houses and water sources.
 - I wear clean gloves.
- 2 Cleaning**
 - I wash reusable equipment in lukewarm water with a mild detergent.
 - I don't use bleach.
 - I clean the mask and filters using a damp cloth without soaking them in water.



- 3 Drying and storage**
 - I let the PPE dry in the open air, in the shade.
 - I store the clean, dry PPE away from chemicals.
- 4 Disposal:** I replace and dispose of all damaged PPE according to current procedures
